It's been so long since we've all been able to be together, we wanted to let you know that we are still here and care for you, your family and friends.

So, we've put together this LFC In Touch, hope you enjoy it.

Since early last year, it has been said that we are all in the same storm (but not the same boat)-probably a good description of how things are in the pandemic. Freak weather conditions can catch people by surprise and the 'storm' we are going through certainly has done that.

Storms toss vessels back and forth, sending contents flying and putting the crews under real pressure to keep afloat. Added to the threatening conditions are the thunderous roars and lightning's intense flashing.

Some vessels fair better than others, they are made differently and react accordingly, so there is an unequal chance of survival. However, none at all are exempt from the threat of the gigantic waves, dragging and thrusting in unpredictable directions. Boats lurch from the crest of the wave disappearing within seconds to the lowest troughs. Disaster strikes at some, as the vessels succumb to the enemy, capsizing, losing people in the icy cold waters.

Panic and fear set in but those with emotional reserves of fortitude conjure up courage. Adrenaline rushes forth and unexpected strength is found.

Many put their own lives at risk as they reach out to others who are drowning. Their limits go beyond that of normal human endurance in order to save others. Life boats are launched as the brave crew put first those in imminently grave danger.

The little harbour lights twinkle in the distance but as land becomes nearer, the cruel waves beat the vessels back out to sea. The people dream of a refuge from this nightmare, their strength quickly declining.

Take comfort 'God is our refuge and strength, a tested help in times of trouble'. If you need a life line, pray for it and then trust He'll throw it to you. In the words of the song 'My lighthouse shining in the darkness, I will follow you, I will trust the promise, you will carry me safe to shore'. The beam of light from God our Father never goes out. Take heart.

Geoff and Cesia in Guatemala



Five years ago, Geoff Baines left his school teaching job in Slough, and us at LFC, to go to Guatemala in South America, as a Christian missionary with Latin Link. While there he met Cesia and they are now married. Currently they are in England for a short while. Geoff is still carrying out some of his work online from his mum's home in Essex. Geoff has sent us this update.

Since 2017, Cesia has been working with a group of women in a ministry called Connected Hearts to work with female prisoners just outside Guatemala City. They work with 85 women in a penitentiary reform centre. This centre understands the value that faith can bring to those who have lost it through the hardships of life. Every Friday they share biblical reflections, companionship, and love with these women, and they run activities including



discipleship, worship and just take time to pray and talk with them. Although currently they can't go into the centre because of Covid-19, they've been able to help at a distance by



recording and sending Bible study videos, sending devotional books, and also fundraising and sending in essentials like shoes and soap. Normally the different prisoners' families would bring them these essentials as the government can't provide them, but due to restrictions the family can't even bring these, so we are privileged to support in this way.

Geoff teaches in a Bible school called the Ezra centre, which responds to the need for training for church leaders, as fewer than 10% of them have any kind of theological Training. As a teacher and coordinator of their diploma programme, he travels to different parts of Guatemala to give classes in Bible and preaching, while other teachers on the programme give classes in counselling, social responsibility and how to run a church.




All of the diplomas within the Ezra Centre place a strong emphasis on social impact; how churches can go outside their four walls and work with a community to improve the standard of living. Some of the graduates from our diploma programmes have started migrant centres, after-school programmes, playgrounds and homeless shelters. The effect the Ezra Centre has on local communities can be felt across rural Guatemala.
