As I look out of the window I see that the seasons are starting to change and that we are moving from Summer to Autumn.. With this in mind our theme this time is things that change and others that stay the same.

Change

We are all subjected to change on a daily basis, but, as a general rule, do you like change? A common answer to this might be 'well it depends on what it is' and of course that makes sense. However, there are those who welcome change with excitement whilst others avoid it as much as possible whether consciously or subconsciously.

Attributed to the Greek philosopher Heraclitus, is the saying "the only thing constant is change". Change can bring about uncertainties, possibilities, happiness, fear, loss, conflict, rejection and many other positive and negative emotions, as well as open-mindedness, education, prospects and other benefits.

One thing we have discovered for ourselves over the last year or so is that loss of freedom restricts our choice, after all isn't that one of the penalties of being imprisoned, and our isolation may have been a bit like that – Imprisonment. There are endless reasons which govern the choices we have, responsibilities, finances, health, abilities, talents, personality, life circumstances and so on.

Sometimes we hear it said 'that was a coincidence' or 'we were just in the right /wrong place at the right/wrong time'. As Christians we believe that God already has a plan for us even before we are born so there are no coincidences. You may well have experienced making a phone call to someone who just at that moment needed that call. Likewise you may remember something someone has said to you, in that moment when you needed to hear it. When people say 'I just had a hunch' – as Christians, these hunches are mostly not hunches but the working of the Holy Spirit, directing our lives. We believe everything changes except God, for it is his abiding presence that sustains us and it is him whom we can always trust and turn to.



My name is Chris and 6 years ago I was at work, and suddenly I thought....I am in the wrong place doing the wrong thing. I need to get out of here. I wasn't sure how I was going to make it work as I had commitments, and anyway what was I going to do with all that free time?

I started praying about it, and just over a year later I left my job, with a vision of getting people together at Langley Free Church. Mainly to be able to open up the church to anybody that wanted a bit of company, friendship, fun and refreshments. Also, with the hope that if anyone needed prayer, then by mentioning it to a member of the team, we could help with that too.

In July 2016 the Monday group opened up, for a couple of hours over the lunchtime period. Up until Covid restrictions it was well attended, and we enjoyed a lot of laughs and Companionship.

Project Possible

Although when Cyrus king of Persia comes to rule in Babylon he releases the exiled Jewish people to return to Jerusalem (Ezra 1:1-3), it is not until around 20 years later that the work of Nehemiah to rebuild the walls occurs. After a secret inspection at night he convenes a meeting of the local leaders:

Be the speck "Come, let us rebuild the wall of Jerusalem, and we will no longer be in disgrace." I also told them about the gracious hand of my God on me and what the king had said to me. They replied, "Let us start rebuilding." So they began this good work. (Nehemiah 2:17,18)

The small Christian charity involved in overseas social action which many of you have supported over the years, previously called Rope, has become Project Possible. Things are changing. The world and its needs are changing. God blessed the exiles return under Ezra. The temple was rebuilt. Worship resumed. Yet Nehemiah, under 'God's gracious hand', comes in to re-invigorate the rebuilding work.

After 30 years as Rope the natural development of our work had shifted even more towards partnering tightly focused projects to support ideas from local communities and individuals that lift them out of disadvantageous, impoverished and challenging circumstances. The renaming of the charity as Project Possible is a fulfilment of God's blessing on the work and His obvious heart's desire to set us on course to help communities over the next 30 years or more.

Just as Nehemiah challenged the leaders to get involved and organised all the teams of everyday people to rebuild, we too are asking you to be ever more enthusiastic to help rebuild people's and children's lives in the oft-forgotten communities of the world.



We are inviting you to be the spark; "In the small corners of the world, people with a tough start in life are making their move. They have ambition, the ideas to make life better. But they need someone to back them, to be their 'spark'." For example, be the spark for the Good Food Apprentices of Worcester, South Africa:

Addictions and gang life left us feeling trapped and isolated. Growing up in broken homes, with little money or opportunities we ended up doing things that

a fresh start when no-one believes in you.


